Festival goers will enjoy delicious oysters, and contribute to a better ecosystem as shells will be gathered for oyster reef restoration projects. This family-friendly festival will feature music, arts and crafts, educational exhibits, a marine discount market, a children's area, food and more.

The Ft. Pierce Yacht Club will be serving grilled oysters with garlic butter and that rounds out this year's oyster menu."
